OLD BUSINESS

Wellness Policy Update- Mr. Wallace was present at today's meeting and ask Kathy Bokeno to give details of the Healthy Davie Forum as she had more details available.

SCHOOL HEALTH UPDATE- Kathy Bokeno, Lead School Nurse

- Nurses are working on the BMI scores for 1st, 3rd and 5th graders; they should be available at the May 8th meeting.
- 8th grader are continuing CPR classes, there are now 10 mannequins and an AED trainer that nurses are using. Nurses along with health teachers are doing hands only CPR training this year. It is now a graduation requirement to have CPR training, these students are not certified.
- Pertussis was in the school system recently, letters were sent home with all students exposed.
- The nurses are preparing for a site visit from the Regional State Consultant next Friday, February 13th, 2015.
- All nurses now have laptops to make their jobs more efficient and mobile.
- Nurses are looking into updating Puberty classes for 6th graders next year.

DENTAL UPDATE- Debbye Kruegar, State Dental Hygienist shared the following updates

- There will be a School Based Sealant Procedure at WRD at no cost to the students; they will serve 25 students per day.
- ECU will be opening a satellite Dental Clinic at Davidson Community College in Thomasville. They will take insurance and also offer a sliding price scale. This will be an opportunity for their graduating dental students to have experience and also help the community. - Debbye reported on March 6-7 a “Missions of Mercy” clinic for adults in financial need with no other options will be held at the Catawba College Gymnasium. They will be offering FREE dental services, Flu shots and Mammograms. The hours are Friday 6am-6pm and Saturday 6am-3pm. Local dental/medical professionals will be volunteering for this event. Debbye handed out posters and pamphlets on this event call or email her with questions.
- Dental screening will start up again in the schools very soon.
- Dental Van is now serving elementary, middle and the high school. Number of students taking advantage of this service continues to increase.

NEW BUSINESS

- Jami Lawhon, Davie County Cooperative Extension representative reported (Snap-Ed) Steps to Health is a 8 week healthy nutrition class going on a CES for the 3rd graders. They met for 30 minutes during the PE class. 92 students are participating and the class includes taste testing and tips on healthy eating. This is just another great program to target child obesity. She shared that she would love to get other schools involved. Information is to be sent to nurses to help coordinate for next year. Paperwork required in August, program begins in January,
 - There is a new Immunization requirement that will go into effect July 2015. At this time rising kindergarteners, 7th graders and 12th graders will be affected. This will of course require more work for our school nurses at the beginning of the school year which is already a busy time.
 - The Healthy Davie Forum is working with the Mebane Foundation and Davie Community Foundation to come up with ways to prevent child obesity.
 - The YMCA received a grant which is currently being used at MES. They have a team who goes to the school and are working extensively with 2nd graders to fight obesity.
 - School nurses are looking into buying scanners to use for eliminating so much paper/copying/ and time in sending out emergency action plans and other documentation shared with teachers and other school personnel.
 - Kathy Bokeno shared after many phone conference calls with the DC and State Health Depts. concerning Ebola. Kathy is now being told the DC Health Dept. will keep schools up to date on how to handle future potential exposures.

There being no more business, the meeting was adjourned at 12:40pm.
