OLD BUSINESS

Wellness Policy Update- George Sulecki, Child Nutrition Director (Replaced Daughn Baker).

SCHOOL HEALTH UPDATE- Kathy Bokeno, Lead School Nurse

- Kathy Bokeno, Lead School Nurse introduced Katie McDaniel to the SHAC committee. Katie replaced Paula Seaford who retired from Davie County Schools on April 1st, 2016. Katie will be at DHS 3 days a week, WEMS 1 day a week and NDMS 1 day a week. We welcome Katie and look forward to her participation with the SHAC program.
 - Kathy reported that pertussis continues in some schools. The health department works very closely with our school nurses in these situations. Kathy reports the school nurses have a wonderful, supportive working relationship with our local health department.
 - Nurses are finishing up with the vision / hearing referrals for this year.
 - Nurses are collecting data for the Prevent Blindness and EOY Nurse's state reports. Both reports are due the end of May.
 - The Healthy Davie Initiative is a program that started from the Mebane Foundation and the Davie Community Foundation. They have brought together 38 agencies to help with healthy activities for Davie County. They are focusing on 3 areas of high need Health, Education and Poverty. Kathy reported on the health portion of this program. She says they are looking at programs that are already in place for different age groups and look to add healthy programs to improve education as well as physical activity for all students. They have presented programs to the elementary principals and will continue to add other ideas over the next 3-5 years to improve the health of our students.
 - There will be a new Ready to Learn Policy and Procedure for all the schools in the state concerning concussions that might happen at school. The state is pleased with the concussion process in place for athletes; however, there needs to be more policy in effect for accidents at school and home regarding head injuries. The state will be sending these guidelines to the LEA.
 - Kathy Bokeno reported the Regional Lead School Nurse update meeting will be in Davie County on May 13th.
 - Dr. Clio Austin questioned the kindergarten assessment verses the new health assessment forms that will be used next year for all students. Kathy reported that in the past only kindergarten students entering NC schools were required to have a health assessment within the first 30 days of enrollment. Starting with the 2016-17 school year all students enrolling in NC schools from another state will be required to have the health assessment performed by a health agency. Next year either the kinder form or the new health assessment form is acceptable

- Becky Boulton, State Dental Hygienist reported the dental screenings have been completed in all the elementary schools. A sealant project is planned for SDMS next year and possibly another at CES. Becky reports her supervisor wants her to do a summer sealant project. Becky has contacted the Y and is waiting to hear back from them. It was suggested that she contact Camp Manna in Cooleemee as there may be a need there as well. Becky plans on visiting the local dentist over the summer as well.

- Kathy Bokeno shared with the group that she and Lori Dingler attended the NC SHAC meeting in Greensboro on March 17th. The program presented was called Ideas to Action. The program was interesting and informative. Kathy and Lori reported they felt our SHAC group was doing a great job following the guidelines and being active in both the schools and community.
- Kathy Bokeno will present to the Board of Education the highlights of our SHAC year.
- Jami Lawhon, DC Cooperative Extension agent is being relocated to the Forsyth/Davidson County agency. She will be replaced by Marilyn Wells whom will be taking over the Davie/Yadkin county position. We look forward to working with her and hope she will become a member of our SHAC group. Many thanks to Jamie for all her hard work and participation with this group and Davie County students.
- Mike Garner announced Davie County has hired a new recreational director, Paul Moore. Mike shared there will be changes to programs offered but many will stay the same. After many years as the chair of the SHAC committee Mike Garner is stepping down, we would like to thank him for all his hard work and dedication to the students of Davie County.
